OHIO VETERANS UNITED ENDORSES MORRIS FOR ATHENS CITY COUNCIL

ATHENS, OH – Oct. 12, 2009 – Ohio Veterans United today announced the endorsement of Randy E. Morris for Athens City Council. The announcement was made by Col. Thomas Moe, honorary chair and founding member of Ohio Veterans United.

Colonel Morris retired in October 2005 as professor of aerospace studies and commander, Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps Detachment 085, University of California, Berkeley. From August 1994 to June 1997, Morris was professor of aerospace studies and commander, AFROTC Detachment 650, Ohio University, Athens. A distinguished graduate of AFROTC he was commissioned as a second lieutenant in June 1975, and is a command pilot with over 4,100 hours in the C-5 and T-38. His awards and citations include: Legion of Merit; Defense Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster; Meritorious Service Medal with four oak leaf clusters; Air Force Commendation Medal; Joint Service Commendation Medal; Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal; Southwest Asia Service Medal and the Kuwait Liberation Medal.

The colonel earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in physics in 1975 from Capital University, Bexley, Ohio and a Master of Arts degree in management and supervision in 1985 from Central Michigan University, Point Pleasant, Mich. Currently Morris is Director of Membership of the National Business Incubation Association. He is a member of the Air Force Association, AmVets, American Legion Post 21 (Athens) and is president of the Athens Civitan Club. He is also a member of the Athens City Commission on Disabilities.

Making the announcement was Col. Moe, a retired United States Air Force pilot who fought in Vietnam and spent five years in captivity as a POW. Some of that time was spent at the Hanoi Hilton, where Col. Moe got to know U.S. Senator John McCain. In 2008, Col. Moe campaigned for Sen. McCain during his run for U.S. President.
